

Crayon Texture Draw and Paint Project



OBJECTIVE

Students can experiment with texture rubbing and watercolor resist. This multistage project lets students learn about layering color and texture.

Materials:

- Prang® Crayons, 24 pack, X00400
- Prang® Watercolor Pad, 9 x 12-inch, 30 count, P2367
- Oval Watercolor Set, 8 count, X00800
- Posterboard
- Scissors
- Hot glue





Activity:

For the teacher:


- 1. Cut the posterboard into 2.5 x 3-inch rectangles.
- 2. Use the hot glue to "draw" different shapes and patterns onto each rectangle.
- 3. Once the hot glue has cooled and set, the rectangles are ready for students to use.

For the students:

- 4. Peel the paper wrapper off of the crayons.
- 5. Place one of the rectangles with the glue on it under the watercolor paper.
- Using the side of the crayon, rub the crayon over section of the watercolor paper with the textured rectangle underneath. A corresponding shape or pattern will appear on the watercolor paper.







- 7. Repeat step 6 until the paper is full of crayon rubbings.
- 8. Using the watercolors, paint over the crayon rubbings. The crayon wil resist the watercolors, resulting in the final artwork.
