


Modeling Clay for Beginners Sculpting Project


Let's Make Clay Lines!



OBJECTIVE

Students can practice creating basic shapes with modeling clay by using these three simple techniques. From there, students can use those same techniques to produce more complex and creative designs.

Materials:

- Prang® Modeling Clay, any color:
 - 4 Assorted Colors, X00740
 - Red, X00781
 - Orange, X00782
 - Yellow, X00783
 - Green, X00784
 - Blue, X00785
 - Purple, X00786
 - White, X00787
 - Brown, X00788
 - Black, X00789
 - Grey, X00790
 - Pink, X00791

Activity:

- Divide modeling clay in to pieces just large enough to fit comfortably in your students' hands.
- 2. Instruct students to roll the modeling clay between their hands in a circular motion to create a **sphere**.
- 3. Instruct students to roll the modeling clay back and forth between their hands to create a **coil**.































Let's Make Clay Lines!

Clay Forms to Know






Sphere: a sphere is a ball


Slab: a slab is flat
